The Ayr-Paris Band is travelling on a 14-day tour to England and Wales, including Torquay; Cardiff, Wales; Liverpool, Northampton, and London.

This is the Ayr-Paris Band's 15th international tour. Each trip offers new experiences with the advantage of travelling with your friends and family. We try to anticipate all points of organization; but, as many of you know, the unexpected is always going to happen.

We have discovered from past trips that by reducing the number of locations, we are able to tour at a more leisurely pace. We are still in the process of planning the trip and the final itinerary will ultimately cater to band jobs when that schedule is finalized.

The cost has been set at \$4,300 per person (double occupancy). Should the budget be increased/reduced, the final trip payment will be increased or reduced. We require that group members are 16 years of age. You must have your travelling partner, for double occupancy. A cost of single travellers is available by request.

since become a bustling city. Where the fort once stood, Cardiff Castle has held court since the 11th century. It remains a central presence in the city, now full of lively art and music venues, hip boutiques, fun bars and modern hotels.



Even with so many new and exciting things to see, the National History Museum is still the most visited attraction in Wales. Don't be the only visitor who plays hooky!

Guided tour of CARDIFF during which you will see Cardiff Castle, the Welsh Assembly, St David's Hall, the Millenium Centre and more

Afternoon visit to St. Fagan's National History Museum

Stop in SHREWSBURY OR CHESTER for lunch on your own and time to explore.

Proceed to Liverpool and check into hotel.

LIVERPOOL is a maritime city in northwest England, where the River Mersey meets the Irish Sea. A key trade and migration port from the 18th to the early 20th centuries, it's also, famously, the hometown of The

Beatles. Ferries cruise the waterfront, where the iconic mercantile buildings known as the "Three Graces" – Royal Liver Building, Cunard Building and Port of Liverpool Building – stand on the Pier Head.

Late afternoon CONCERT in the Wirral – or WARRINGTON choir exchange in nearby Warrington.

Free day in LIVERPOOL for sightseeing or shopping.

Options include The British Music experience in the Cunard Building opens in 2017, the U-Boat story in Birkenhead, the International Slavery Museum, the Titanic Memorial. The Albert Dock is one of Britain's top heritage attractions, situated in a spectacular riverside setting as part of Liverpool's UNESCO designated World Heritage Site.

CONCERT at Ness Botanical Gardens – or joint concert with WARRINGTON Choir, in nearby Warrington.

MONDAY, JULY 30: LIVERPOOL - NORTHAMPTON

Breakfast at the hotel

Depart by coach for NORTHHAMPTON

Stop enroute at ALTHORP ESTATE (birthplace and burial site of Princess Diana) for tour and possible CONCERT.



Continue by coach to NORTHAMPTON and check in to the hotel. HOTEL: Click Here

NORTHAMPTON is the county town of Northamptonshire in the East



Midlands of England. It is also the imaginary crossing point between the north and south of England. Archaeological evidence of settlement in the area dates back to the Bronze Age, Roman and Anglo-Saxon periods.

Northampton Market is one of

the oldest in the country and Northampton is known for its rich shoe market.

TUESDAY, JULY 31: NORTHAMPTON

Breakfast at the hotel

Visit to BLETCHLEY PARK, WWII Spy Centre. Codebreakers penetrated the secret communications of the Axis Power – most



importantly the German Enigma and Lorenz ciphers. The official historian of World War II British Intelligence has written that the

"Ultra" intelligence produced at Bletchley shortened the war by two to four years.

Transfer to HENLEY ON THAMES with CONCERT in the Bandstand.

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 1: NORTHAMPTON – LONDON

Breakfast at the hotel



Depart by coach for LONDON with enroute stop at Blenheim Palace – possible CONCERT

Proceed to London hotel. HOTEL: Click Here

Free time to explore Covent Garden on arrival.

London, the capital of England and the United Kingdom, is a 21st-century city with history stretching back to Roman times. At its centre stand the imposing Houses of Parliament, the iconic 'Big Ben' clock tower and Westminster Abbey,



site of British monarch coronations. Across the Thames River, the London

Eye observation wheel provides panoramic views of the South Bank cultural complex, and the entire city.

Guided sightseeing tour of LONDON –Big Ben and the Houses of Parliament; Westminster Abbey; Trafalgar Square; Buckingham Palace; St Paul's Cathedral, Piccadilly Circus and more.

CONCERT at Victoria Embankment Gardens (or Canadian Embassy)

Option to attend a West End Show.



FRIDAY, AUGUST 3: LONDON

Breakfast at the hotel

Full day at leisure in London.

Option to visit Downton Abbey (Highclere Castle), about one hour from London.

Farewell dinner in a local restaurant

SATURDAY, AUGUST 4: LONDON - TORONTO

Check out of the hotel and load coach for transfer by coach to airport and check in for return flight to Canada.
